2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

KMV employs a comprehensive approach to cater to the diverse learning needs of its students, effectively categorizing them into two distinct groups: slow learners and advanced learners. This categorization is based on a thorough assessment of their performance in both class activities (Class Performance or CPs) and periodic evaluations, specifically the Mid-Semester Tests (MSTs). To ensure transparency and accessibility, information about these groupings, along with their respective timetables, is prominently displayed on notice boards and communicated through dedicated student WhatsApp groups.

For slow learners, absentee students, and those actively involved in extracurricular activities such as youth festivals and sports, Remedial Classes are conducted. Each student is also assigned a teacher mentor who closely monitors their academic progress and provides valuable counselling and guidance.

Advanced learners, on the other hand, are provided with additional assignments and extensive reading materials. They are encouraged to participate in seminars, deliver paper presentations, engage in poster presentations, and compete in quiz contests.

Recognizing and appreciating the efforts of the students, KMV award a special 'Effort Grade' to slow learners who demonstrate marked academic improvement. Advanced learners are also acknowledged with attractive prizes and scholarships. Teachers maintain detailed records to track the progress of both slow and advanced learners, ensuring a holistic approach to their academic development.

It is readily accessible to all stakeholders through the college website. Throughout the academic year, all important academic milestones are adhered to as per the academic calendar. Internal viva and practical exams for labs and projects are diligently conducted by respective

departments. Moreover, remedial classes are thoughtfully scheduled, catering to students who require additional support in various faculties, aligning with the academic calendar.

Teaching Plans: To ensure efficient time management, the Time Table Committee allocates specific hours for each course as per the program's scheme. Each department meticulously prepares a month-wise course planning file, detailing the syllabus for each course. These files are made available to students through the Dean of Academics and the College Library for reference. The individual faculty has the freedom to create their teaching plans. According to the outlined plan, 25% of the syllabus should be covered before CP-I, Mid Term examinations takes place out of the 50% of syllabus and next 25% of the syllabus has to be covered before the final examinations. Teachers adapt their unique strategies to implement this teaching plan by adopting different dynamic, interactive, collaborative and experiential teaching-learning methods.

In the year 2022-23, following reforms were under taken in the examination procedures:

1. For smooth and efficient working of examination centers, a team of senior faculty members were appointed to perform the duties of observers during the conduct of MST.
2. All PG Degree Programmes have been transferred to Credit Based Continuous Evaluation Grading System (CBCEGS). The examination and evaluation policy passed for CBCEGS in meeting of second Academic Council and amended in fourth Governing Body meeting has been extended and implemented for these programmes.
3. A few Interdisciplinary courses have been introduced for every PG Degree Programme.
4. New Certificate Courses have also been introduced for those students who aren't able to pursue a degree programme. Students registered for Under-Graduate or Post-Graduate Programmes can also pursue Certification Courses related to their field.
5. During the session 2022-23, date sheet module has been created in IMS to generate the tentative date sheet for the conduct ESE of even semester.
6. The college was registered with the "National Academic Depository (NAD) Digilocker" and ABC, which is the first step in this regard. The second step of uploading students' data on the portal, who have registered in session 2021-22, has also been achieved. The officials of UGC dealing with the ABC have been contacted for the problems faced during uploading of the data.

Structured End-of-Semester Examinations: To ascertain the achievement of learning outcomes, the institution meticulously structures end-of-semester examination question papers on a unit-wise basis, with questions explicitly aligned with specific course outcomes. Evaluators systematically gauge and record students' attainment of each course outcome on standardized evaluation sheets. These records are subsequently processed through the software to derive the attainment of programme-specific outcomes (PSOs), offering a comprehensive insight into the overall program effectiveness.

Performance Review through Academic Audit: The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducts Academic Audits, focusing on students' progression to higher education and their placement rates, thereby ensuring that the outcomes meet industry and academic standards.

Submission of Academic Records: The examination branch diligently

compiles and submits academic records of each academic program to the IQAC at the conclusion of each session. This practice allows for in-depth evaluation and continuous improvement.

With a sufficient number of computer terminals at disposal, the library facilitates various essential tasks, including searching the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), accessing e-resources, web browsing, e-reading, printing, downloading, and supporting other academic endeavours.

KMV library is equipped with a robust internet connection boasting a 14MBPS bandwidth for swift and uninterrupted connectivity. Additionally, the digital repository serves as a treasure trove, offering access to archived materials such as books, question papers, research publications, theses, annual reports, newsletters, newspaper clippings, and more.

An automated attendance system captures the entry of all library users, employing a scanner at the entrance to accurately count footfalls within the library. For added security, an RF gate has been installed at the library entrance and each book in our collection is tagged with an RF tag, further enhancing security and safeguarding our valuable resources from theft.

The college currently maintains an extensive network infrastructure, comprising 200 network connections that span over twenty buildings across the campus. This network has steadily expanded to accommodate nearly 450 connections, showcasing the institution's commitment to providing robust connectivity to its stakeholders.

In terms of internet connectivity, KMV relies on Quadrant Televentures Ltd. as its service provider, with a leased line offering a total bandwidth availability of 58 Mbps. Additionally, the college maintains 13 independent leased line connections from Quadrant Televentures Ltd, further reinforcing its connectivity infrastructure.

To facilitate the acquisition of hardware and peripherals, the Hardware Purchase committee adheres to specific procurement guidelines, ensuring that the institution invests wisely in technology resources. Meanwhile, the Website committee is responsible for the upkeep of the official college website (<http://kmvjalandhar.ac.in>) and provides faculty members with the means to host their pages on the same platform.

KMV recognizes its role as the custodian of all institutional data generated within the college. This includes the management of a comprehensive Management Information System (MIS), encompassing modules related to online admission, fees, accounts, examination, transport, hostel, and library. Furthermore, the college has a dedicated team responsible for the development and maintenance of a Learning Management System (LMS), supported by in-house Rack Servers to manage LMS data efficiently. This commitment to technological infrastructure underscores KMV's dedication to providing a modern and efficient learning environment.

Major repairs are outsourced to reputable vendors. Irreparable systems are subject to a meticulous write-off and e-item disposal procedure.

Library maintenance is entrusted to the Librarian and a team of dedicated library assistants. A Library Advisory Committee plays a crucial role in providing guidance on the acquisition of valuable books, internet journals, as well as necessary hardware and software.

The care and maintenance of our sports facilities, including playgrounds, swimming pool, gymnasium, and sports infrastructure, are diligently overseen by the faculty, coaches, and support staff of the Physical Education Department.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the various institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from the policies, administrative set-up, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

The institution's governance structure is intricately organized to

ensure efficient administration and decision-making. At the apex level, the KMV Managing Committee serves as the principal executive body, wielding the necessary powers to administer the institution effectively. Further support and guidance for policy formulation and execution are provided by the Governing Body, Academic Council, Finance Committee, and Boards of Studies.

A dynamic administrative team, under the Principal's dynamic leadership including the IQAC, Faculty Deans, Dean of Student Welfare, Dean of Extracurricular Activities (ECA), Dean of Research, Academic Audit Committee, and various officers, work collaboratively to ensure collective leadership and smooth operation.

Efficiency is maintained through various committees like the Examination Cell, Admission Committee, Academic Audit Committee, Research Committee, and Students Welfare Committee, overseeing their respective areas and submitting reports to the Principal for action. A robust administrative setup led by the Office Superintendent and Examination Superintendent oversees three key branches: the General Administrative Office, Accounts Office, and Examination Office.

Regarding appointments, a committee comprising representatives from management, the University, and DPI follows UGC and DPI guidelines to fill permanent faculty positions. Contractual faculty and non-teaching staff are appointed by a committee comprising management representatives, the Principal and the HODs. For promotions, the IQAC screens Level I-III faculty based on CAS, while Level IV promotions involve a selection committee following UGC/DPI norms. Promotions are based on API-PBAS scores.

This step scrutinizes the College's financial statements and budget projections for the next fiscal year, with the Principal presenting them at the Annual Management Committee meeting.

The third step involves external financial auditing carried out by local auditors from the Government of Punjab. This meticulous process encompasses a thorough examination of all financial aspects, including fee collections, donations, grants, contributions, interest earnings, and expenditure on staff, vendors, contractors, students, and service providers. Also, all Utilization Certificates submitted to grant-giving agencies receive countersignature from the College's Chartered Accountant.

KMV has consistently maintained a clean audit record, with no major audit objections encountered in previous years. This steadfast commitment to financial probity underscores our dedication to providing a transparent and accountable financial environment for our stakeholders.

Assessment is based on CPI, CPII, MSTs, and End Semester Examinations, with performance as a key indicator. Departments maintain records of assessments and attendance, reviewed via an

Academic Audit by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The co-curricular events such as quizzes, group discussions, field visits, and internships enhance practical application, enriching their educational experience and skill development.

(II) Registration with Digi Locker and Academic Bank of Credits - KMV is committed to digital innovation and has registered with Digi Locker and the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). We have successfully uploaded academic credentials for students from the 2021-22 session on the Digi Locker portal, ensuring secure storage and facilitating the benefits of a multiple entry and exit system for credit system students.

KMV has adopted healthy practices for the MANAGEMENT OF DEGRADABLE AND NON-DEGRADABLE WASTE through segregation, recycling, Incineration, composting etc. The campus is provided with a complete set of garbage bins for different types of bio and non-bio degradable. (Wet and dry waste). Different colored bins are placed in order to collect and segregate various types of waste- plastic waste, paper waste, bio-waste etc. Different methods such as pit composting, vermi-composting, bacterial composting using bacterial consortium is used to treat the bio degradable waste. There are three composting and eight vermi compost pits to handle garden remains, waste food and vegetables are treated in compost pits by inoculation of E.M. solutions. E-waste is collected and disposed through government licensed vendors. There is zero medical wastage. under sanitary waste guideline 2018 Automatic Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine and Incinerator are used. Minimum usage of Paper is encouraged and waste Paper are disposed of to junk collector. The handling and storage of chemicals in chemistry lab is strictly done according to the "Chemicals Waste Management Guidelines". Cleaning of the campus is done on daily basis.
