

**Agenda Item 1.** To discuss the action taken report on quality initiatives of college of session 2021-22.

**Action Taken Report:**

<b>Plan of Action</b>	<b>Achievements/Outcomes</b>
<b>New courses and Teaching Learning</b>	
To introduce skill based elective courses in BA.	KMV took lead in introducing new age multidisciplinary programs which are most contemporary and job enabling. During 2021-22 two interdisciplinary programmes namely BA Vocational Studies in Visual Communication and BA Vocational Studies in Retail Management were introduced. Moreover, two diplomas namely Early Child Care and Old Age Care with internationally accepted sector skill certification were also introduced.
Internship embedded syllabi as per UGC directives	During 2021-22, Board of Study meetings of 36 departments were held with the objective of formation of new syllabi of various programmes and in order to sync the syllabi as per the New Education Policy for the upcoming academic session.

	Internships are made mandatory part of curriculum in more and more programmes. For example one whole semester of B.Com. (Hons.) and BBA has been dedicated to internship to make the education more skill oriented.
Introduce audit course on Innovation, Entrepreneurship & job readiness catering to students' placement.	Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Creative Thinking and Job Readiness program are introduced for semester V students and these courses help to prepares the students to start their own enterprises by innovating new business models in their respective fields and to prepare for various jobs respectively. These courses are offered to students as part of their degree without any extra fees.
To add new Diploma and certificate programmes from session 2021-22.	During 2021-22, based on feedback of students. Diploma in Geriatrics Care and two certificate courses in domestics data entry and certificate course in Geriatrics Care were introduced.
To organise online/offline workshops and extension lectures.	The college organised 40 workshops and 58 Webinars/ extension lectures by different departments to enhance the knowledge base of students and to provide opportunity to students to interact with various renowned resource persons and experts.
To arrange industrial training for students.	During 2021-22 session, industrial training was organised for <b>471</b> students in various industries like tourism, food industry, chemical industry, textile, hospitals and business houses to provide students hands on training.
To organise intra college and inter-college competitions, exhibitions.	To enrich teaching learning process. <b>32</b> Inter College competitions like Brain Storm-2021, KITE-22, Litmania-An Ode to creativity, were held and <b>130</b> intra college competitions like quiz, PPT, Declamation, Debate Poster making etc. were organised during the year. Also annual exhibitions like Sukriti were also held.  In addition to these, 11 industrial and 22 educational trips were also organised during the session.

Teachers will be encouraged to develop online teaching modules.	Teachers were provided faculty training to develop MOOCs and about ten proposals were sent by teachers. Two teachers from Psychology Department Dr. Sharanjit and Dr. Pratima got their MOOCs proposal sanctioned from Education Consortium UGC.
Students will be encouraged to use national level online teaching resources.	Students were made aware of online resources and they have attended many online courses like one student Ms. Mehak Verma, a student of BCA Sem VI has achieved <b>eleven</b> MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) certifications on C++, Java, HTML CSS, Bootstrap, Python, Wordpress Elementor, Php, MySQL, Unity & Game Maker Studio etc. with flying colors.
<b>To inculcate scientific temperament amongst students</b>	
To organise scientific quiz, competitions, experimental workshops and other scientific activities.	Science departments have organised five International lectures/virtual lab visits, three seminars, six workshops, ten quiz competitions on different topics like Towards Zero Leprosy, on Madam Curie to celebrate birth Anniversary of Madam Curie, National Periodic Table Day, National Science Day, on IPR, Mathematical quiz Mastishk, Celebrating 175 <sup>th</sup> Birthday of Thomas Alva Edison etc. and celebrated seven national and international days to popularise science.
To arrange various activities to popularise science.	College attained CURIE (Consolidation of University Research for innovation and Excellence) grant worth 70 lakhs to enhance infrastructure of Science Departments and to organise activities to popularise Science from Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India.  Activities like power point presentations and paper presentations on topics like Role of Biotechnology in Défense, Role of Chemistry in Prevention of COVID-19, Food Safety, World Food Day, to Infinity and Beyond, General Nutrition, Food Myths, World Science Day and six educational trips were organised to make science subjects more attractive.

## Research, Extension and Consultancy

Research mentoring committee will be executed with external peer members to check progress of already sanctioned projects.

A Research and Development Centre (RDC) was set up in the college. Under RDC, five committees were formulated as per the UGC guidelines. A research mentoring committee was formulated which conducted meetings to check progress of ongoing seed money projects. Presentations were made by the Principal Investigators of eight seed money projects. The external experts' comments about the progress of the projects were recorded in minutes of these meetings. Some projects were also approved for submission.

Proposals will be invited for fresh sanction of projects under seed money.

Research awards will be announced in Junior and Senior Category to inspire the teachers for quality research.

To promote research among its faculty and students, seed money of Rs.315000 was sanctioned out of college funds to the faculty and students of eight departments for the session 2021-22. The faculty who are awarded with the research projects are Dr. Jatinder Pal from Department of Economics, Mr. Ashish Raina from Department of Hospitality and Tourism, Mr. Nitin Khanna and Dr. Ravi Khurana from Department of Computer science, Dr. Harpreet Kaur and Dr. Narinderjit Kaur from Department of Fashion designing and Chemistry respectively, Dr. Harpreet Kaur and Dr. Davinder Kaur from Department of Punjabi, Dr. Reena and Ms. Seema from Department of Punjabi, Dr. Anushobha and Dr. Rupika Sharma from Department of Hindi & Mrs. Ashima Sahni and Dr. Iqbal Singh from Department of Political Science.

Two teachers were selected for research awards of Rs. 10000 each based on quality of research. In senior category award was given to Dr. Neetu Verma from Physics Department and in junior category it was presented to Dr. Monica Rani from Maths department.

Submit project proposal for research grant	Nine proposals were submitted for research project funding to different Govt. agencies like SERB-DST, CSIR and ICSSR New Delhi POWER. Out of these projects, three projects were sanctioned by the funding agencies, by SERB to Dr. Gopi Sharma worth 27 Lakh, CURIE grant of 70 lakh to Science Departments, grant of 7.28 Lakh by ICSSR to Dr. Rashmi Sharma from Department of Commerce.
Various activities will be undertaken under Institution Innovation Cell (IIC).	<p>KMV IIC organises various self-driven activities round the year, which includes inviting experts having entrepreneurial experience of years, organising business idea competitions to business model canvas developments, workshops on design thinking and IPR. As per new policy following steps will be taken: Departments will allocate one person as in charge of certificate course officially with formal letter signed by Principal. Same faculty will held complete responsibility of admission in that certificate course. Examination will be carried at Departmental level and mode of examination can be decided at departmental level. Departments can schedule examination twice in one academic year i.e December or June. 15 days before conduct of examination students must fill examination form and obtain Roll no from COE office. It will be the duty of concerned faculty to take examination forms from

examination centre, get it filled from students and deposit it back to Mr. Munish. After conduct of examination the awards must be submitted to Mr. Munish on same day so that results can be declared on time.

The designated faculty will submit completion certificate of the certificate course to examination office duly signed by head of department. The copy of the same must be kept at department level. Concerned faculty will keep complete record of certificate course i.e Admissions list, attendance sheet, module delivery plan, feedback obtained from students at the end of course, awards, and final copy of gazette notification and completion certificate. Concerned faculty can claim 2 marks per certificate course in his/her API as per new rules of UGC regulations 2018.

These certificate courses will be offered in hybrid mode (partially online and offline mode) and same will be kept in Academic Council agenda.

There is ongoing problem that comes to notice from examination centre that the students complaint about out of syllabus question(s) in the question papers.
