Financial Accounting Module: Creates daily Fee/ Fine Collection vouchers automatically, Enters cash and bank receipts / payments vouchers, Contra Entry Vouchers, prints reports like cheque register, Cash Book, Day Book, General Ledger, Bank book reconciliation, Trial Balance, Income and Expenditure statements and Balance Sheet. Payroll Management Module: Calculates monthly Net payable as per Pay Scale and Grade Pay for teaching and nonteaching staff. Prepares the paysheet report as per Allowances Deductions norms. Prepares various submissions forms to concerned authorities for sanction government agencies. Scholarship Module: Maintains enrollment of students in various Scholarship schemes. Checks Scheme sanctions, Undertakes disbursement, generates utilization certificate, tracks scholarship fund flow, etc. Library Module: In this module detail of books according to accession number is entered as well as issue/return of books are handled in this module.

Biometric for Teachers and Nonteaching staff: Keeps track of attendance of staff .This module contains the staff data and attendance recodes according to staff id and maintains record of staff attendance date and time wise. Feedback:Student feedback is a local module that gives a feedback form to students with some questions related to organization. This module maintains data for student feedback. Transportation:It's related to routes and related fee of the routes, maintains data of student with bus fee records. SMS Integration:SMS integration used to send fee/attendance/marks details to enrolled phone number against the student. This module is also used to send important notices to student. Hostel :Prints Cash Receipts, advances or online fee receipts as per collection procedure. Tracks Students Hostel Fees pending / outstanding dues as per different headings, mess fee records, provides summary reports of outstanding dues of students,

Feedback Obtained
<p>The college holds meetings to review the adequacy and viability of the existing programs and the changes required to compete with the contemporary system are discussed with all the faculty members. The existing programs are reviewed and new age programs introduced to create better opportunities for students. Feedback from students, alumni, parents, academic peers and community are obtained for the formulation and introduction of new courses. a) Students: A Performa based on NAAC recommendations has been designed to obtain feedback on the curriculum. The Performa is distributed through a random selection of students. b) Alumni: Alumnae meet which is a regular feature provides a platform to its old students to participate in college activities and give their valuable suggestions on the curriculum. c) Parents: The feedback on curriculum is obtained during the ParentTeacher Meet organized to apprise the parents with the performance of their ward and obtain their feedback on the functioning of the college. d) Industries: Regular interaction with industry experts by inviting them for delivering expert talks and industrial visits organized for the students provide an opportunity to interact with the industrial sector and obtain their inputs on the curriculum. e) Academic Peers: National seminars, conferences, workshops and extension lectures organized from time to time facilitate exchange of ideas with the peer group and update the faculty about the latest emerging trends. f) Community: Fairs, cultural programs, social outreach activities provide opportunity to interact with community and introduce need based programs. The feedback thus obtained is analysed. Inhouse departmental meetings are held to review the courses and programmes. The Principal discusses the key findings with the Deans and Heads of the Departments. The changes recommended in various courses are tabled in Board of Studies meetings by the member teachers for appropriate inclusion. Resolutions adopted after consultations with Academic Council and Governing Body are communicated to the affiliating university. The college networks with the stakeholders to collect and document responses on curriculum from the stakeholders. The students express their opinion on curriculum through feedback. Feedback from Parents on curriculum, placement, trends and teaching methodology is obtained during Parent Teacher Meeting sessions. The feedback has been utilized in enriching the curriculum in the following manner: ? The present syllabi of nearly all programmes are based on industry market needs. ? Parents have recommended starting post graduate course M.Sc. Botany as college started M.Sc chemistry and Zoology in 201819. They have further recommended reducing semester syllabi ? Masters in Chemistry, Zoology, Punjabi, Fine Arts, Psychology, Cosmetology, Journalism and Mass Communication, B.Sc. Agriculture and B.Sc. Hons. English is introduced to meet the demand of stakeholders. ? All M.Voc and B.Voc programs are introduced to enable students to have a better grasp of the industry requirements. ? Punjab History and Culture subject has been reintroduced on the basis of feedback given by out of state students and their parents.</p>

Details about the welfare schemes are announced in the Morning Assembly and displayed on the notice board. Mentor tries to counsel the students regarding any academic or personal problem faced by the student but in certain cases recommend the student to the counsellor of the Institution for professional counseling. The Student Welfare Department addresses and responds to all the queries both (academic and nonacademic) of the students and also guides the students to avail of various welfare schemes. Under the Student Welfare Department, there is a Counseling cell for professional counseling, Cell against Sexual Harassment, Readers' club, Health club, Anti Ragging cell, book Lost and Found Cell, Grievances Redressal Cell, Scholarships and Fee Concession committee and Stress Buster Club bank to facilitate the students. The institution also have career counseling and placement cell to guide the students for their future advancement. The objective of mentoring is to • Help new learners to settle into the college/ program • Help to establish good communication between new learners and college staff and other learners • Provide support for the individuals who might be isolated or lack support and selfconfidence • Offer appropriate advice and guidance/ Counseling of any issue of the student • Help student to see the way ahead – progression and career opportunities • Give and receive constructive feedback about the learning environment and infrastructure • Help mentees to manage time, plan and prioritize work, set goals and action plan, gain a better understanding of their studies. Training programs like 'Mentoring the Mentors' are also held from time to time to prepare the faculty for mentoring. Apart from this, there are many programs like Foundation Course, Personality Development course, Spoken English course, etc. available to boost the overall personality of the student.

4.4.2 – Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (maximum 500 words) (information to be available in institutional Website)

The college has augmented the infrastructure to keep pace with academic advancement and growth. Apart from adding a new structure (rooms and labs) it has upgraded laboratories, purchased additional instruments and equipment in existing labs, sports equipment and computers software. The college ensures optimal utilization of budget allocated for the maintenance and upkeep of the college infrastructure by holding regular meetings of various committees constituted to plan and monitor the projects to be taken up in a session. The Heads of the Departments prepare the proposals as per the requirements of their respective departments. Based on the need assessment equipments, furniture, labs, classroom, budget, provisions are optimally made. There is full fledged infrastructure maintenance section headed by an overseer for construction and maintenance of physical infrastructure. The overseer is supported by Supervisor and a team of skilled workers. The Principal, on the basis of the perspective development plan, proposes the infrastructural augmentation needs to the concerned authorities. The UGC, DST and DBT sanction funds based on the requirements, student strength, and the nature of the academic programs offered by the institution. The college development fund is utilized for maintenance and minor repairs of furniture and equipments. The various committees prepare the proposal and estimated cost of the planned maintenance and purchase of equipments and submit it to the head of the institution. An effective monitoring system through various committees ensures the optimal utilization of budget allocated. The Overseer not only supervises construction but also takes care of maintenance and repair of buildings, water lines, electrical installations, equipment and other support services. Wherever the need arises, the concerned department writes application stating the nature of repair/ maintenance required. The college has full time Administrative officer, Mechanic, Plumber, Electrician and Technician. The Administrative officer takes care of the regular repair and maintenance needs. The applications by the concerned department are sent to the administration officer after being sanctioned for necessary action. Computer Maintenance: As far as maintenance is concerned, outside vendors are contacted for major repairs and for minor repairs. Software problems are taken care of by computer faculty and lab staff. Nonrepairable systems are kept in store and disposed off after proper procedure of writing off and disposal of items. The institution purchases the new upgraded computer systems from time to time as per the needs. The college also has a library advisory committee. Library Maintenance - There is a Library Advisory Committee whose major responsibilities are as follows: ? The committee formulates development plans and recommends facilities for implementation ? The committee gives guidelines for the procurement of costly books, internet journals, hardware and software necessary for the library ? The committee ensures the optimal use of library facility by staff and students ? The

committee organizes book fairs as well as visits to national and international book fairs ? It ensures the availability of latest syllabi in the library ? It takes up remedial actions towards the grievances expressed by the students and staff

#### 6.1 – Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 – Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words)

The administration is decentralized to a large extent. The Principal with the support of Deans, Heads of the Departments and various committees participate in decision making which create an organizational "climate participatory" democracy. Administrative powers and responsibilities are delegated to teachers on the basis of their competence, commitment and aptitude to meet the institutional objectives: ? To balance workloads and provide development opportunities to staff ? To create positive and motivating environment ? To build team among staff to speed up the process of target achievement and accomplish assignments ? To allow staff to take initiative One of the practice is syllabus revision and introduction of new programmes. Principal along with IQAC holds meetings with Planning and Evaluation committee to review the existing curricula and programmes and the changes required are discussed with all the faculty members. Feedback of students and their parents on the desired changes in the curriculum are also obtained by IQAC. Industrial -academia meets are held from time to time and the feedback based on these meetings is also taken into consideration. The Management's vision and perception of teaching programs is also conveyed to the House through Principal. After thorough discussion a draft is prepared by planning and evaluation committee members and heads or deans communicate the suggestions/recommendations to the Board of Studies meeting held in the college for redesigning the programs for appropriate and effective inclusion. BOS have members from University, Industry, member from other institution of higher education and one alumni of the College. During BOS, interaction is held with all members from industry, research bodies and the university in effective operationalization of the curriculum. Then the BOS minutes are passed from Academic Council which again has representatives from University and other Institutions of importance as well as state nominee. The Academic Council meeting minutes are passed from Governing Body which includes experts from the service sectors (hospitals), small and medium scale industry, and civil society who ensure effective implementation of the curriculum. Second practice is effective implementation of the policies and plans of the institution. IQAC conducts a selfevaluative exercise for all the departments to draw a potential map of the strengths and weaknesses of the functioning of the college in various areas. Various committees like Examination Committee, Admission committee, Grievances redress committee, Academic Audit Committee, Research Committee, and Students Welfare Committee which have been established to facilitate efficient and smooth functioning of the college also evaluate the performance in their respective areas and submit the reports to the Principal. The committees are directed to prepare action plans based on the potential map and submit the same to the principal for approval. The Principal appoints their charges for various committees and nominates the members of committees based on the potential map. The guidelines defining the roles and responsibilities of the committees are communicated to the members. Objectives of the Practice: ? To inculcate patriotism ? To impart valuebased education ? To empower women ? To arouse social consciousness ? To counsel the students ? To contribute to national development

The Context: Conceived and initiated with the avowed aim of arousing nationalistic pride, imparting information and providing a platform for collective thinking and community feeling (strategizing future course of action)at a time when the nation was reeling under foreign yoke, the practice of Morning Assembly has an added significance and relevance in present times when gross materialism and consumerism have overridden ethical and patriotic values. Knowing that values are imbibed rather than taught, the college has adopted this practice to counsel the students and inculcate those values that are needed to live in a pluralistic society and contribute to national development.

The Practice: Monday morning assembly, a regular and important feature of the college, is a subtle manifestation of the collective consciousness and purposeful education of KMV,.The national flag is hoisted and national songs–“Vande Matram” and “Jan Gan Man” are sung with nationalistic fervour. Worthy of mention is the fact that at a time when singing of National Song invited flogging and hoisting of the national flag was deemed a crime against the British empire,in Kanya Maha Vidyalaya the students spun charkha,wore Khadi,hoisted national flag and sang “Vande Matram” with full throated fervor. In keeping with the same patriotic and Gandhian spirit, Khadi uniform, synonymous with freedom struggle and empowerment of women is still worn on Mondays. It is compulsory for all students to come in white Khadi uniform (White Khadi suit and White Muslin Dupatta). The national fabric and pride of India, Khadi serves as a great equalizer, enthuses the students with the essence of our rich, vibrant cultural heritage and inculcates patriotism. Above all, this assembly of heteogenous students in white khadi, while creating a feeling of belonging, a spirit of oneness and nurturing everlasting bonds subtly manifests and promotes secularism and social equity. Thought for the Day is given to in still values among students and arouse the intellectual, moral and social consciousness of students. The thought provoking ‘Pearls of Wisdom’ and the collective counselling prepares every student to raise herself intellectually and morally so as to face the stern realities of life with confidence and courage. Each student of the college is expected to look on herself as the ambassador of the college and conduct herself with dignity that is worthy of the institution.

Awards and Laurels: The students achievers, who have won laurels for the

college on the academic and coacademic/cocurricular front are honoured and awarded prizes to inspire and motivate the students to aim for the sky and achieve their goals. The initiatives of NSS Volunteers are also lauded and given due recognition to infuse students with an ardent sense of responsible citizenship for nation building and to impinge upon the students' mind the need to meaningfully contribute towards meeting societal needs. Faculty achievements are also highlighted to offer role models for the students to look up to and emulate. Collective Counselling: Official instructions, announcements regarding intracollege and intercollege competitions and upcoming events are made. Rapt in attention the students listen carefully to the instructions given during the assembly and follow them earnestly. The mission of the college to reinforce the culture of excellence and contribute to national development is substantially met with through Morning Assembly which imparts value-added education and inculcates patriotic fervor. Evidence of Success: The practice has exercised a great motivational influence on the student community. Motivated by the student achievers and honors conferred on them, the students are recognizing their potentialities, shedding their inhibitions and coming forward to participate in various activities being organized by the college. What is laudable is that they are benchmarking their achievements and effort. The achievements of the competent teachers in their respective fields further fire them to give their best and outperform. Well defined value system and love for our culture has given strong roots and poise to our students and facilitated their moral and intellectual growth. It has gone a long way in inculcating a strong sense of ethical values, a genuine concern for our culture and commitment to nationalistic causes. We have a galaxy of alumni who have done the college proud by making significant contribution in ameliorating the lot of oppressed, marginalized sections of society. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: The problem area is time table. A lot of rescheduling and adjustment in time table has to be done to enable all the teachers to meet their respective classes and prevent any academic loss. Duration of each period has to be reduced to hold the assembly. (II) Empowering Lesser Privileged Women through Skill Development Counselling Objectives of the Practice: ? To give vocational, career oriented and technical education to lesser privileged women ? to counsel and motivate women to lead a dignified life ? to empower women for changing fundamental aspects ? to sensitize women in general and society in particular about gender issues ? to create a mental climate for ensuring gender equity ? to contribute to national development The Context: KMV is rooted firmly in the belief that no society can thrive if it excludes half the population of globe, namely women, from the onward march of progress. Ever since its inception in 1886, the college has been rendering valuable service for the emancipation and empowerment of women. Fully aware of the countless psychosocial pressures which are deeply embedded in attitudes, practices and behaviour patterns across the world and adversely impact the wellbeing of women, KMV seeks novel and practical ways to create more opportunities for empowering women. Issues like gender discrimination within family, lack of decision making powers and pressures of social attitudes cause acute depression and lead to unhappiness among women. The economic status of women which is in a pathetic condition further limits the growth and development of women. Enhancing women's economic status is an important strategy for improving the welfare of Indian women living below poverty line. An effort is made to ameliorate the stress and limiting factors among women by helping women who could not complete their education due to familial, economic or social reasons. Vocational certificate courses are designed to equip lesser privileged women with skills to enable them to become economically independent and gain confidence. Skill development and vocational training in areas like textile designing, cosmetology, food preservation, basic computer basics, communication skills and classes in personality development which focus on entrepreneurial skills are provided to ensure employability. The Practice: As part of its mission of empowering women

through education and selfreliance, the college has established the Gandhian Study Centre and Women's Studies Centre (under the aegis of UGC) that are vigorously involved in providing counselling and job skills to women from lesser privileged sections of society. The Centres are dedicated to improving the lives of young women through counselling and advocacy of a range of services that promote personal growth and economic independence. The Centres very enthusiastically engage in advocacy work to achieve greater equality and social justice for women Vocational Training: Vocational training on cutting, stitching, cosmetology, computer basics, etc. is imparted to help them gain control of their lives and exercise greater control in society. Certificate courses in garment designing, cosmetology, computers are organized free of cost for rural women. The girls are given training in Fashion Designing, Block Printing, Fabric Painting, Candle Making, Pot Decoration, Paper Mache, Cosmetology and Basic Computers. Counselling: The centre offers counselling to women covering a number of issues like health, hygiene and income generation. Counselling is provided to women who have experienced violence and are coping with challenges (both physical and mental). Counselling staff offers girls and young women counselling services for career options and support and strategies for coping with stress. Special sessions are conducted to create awareness amongst them regarding their health issues and their rights. Awards and Laurels: The young women, who have been able to achieve the desired goal of economic independence and set up entrepreneurial units are honoured and awarded prizes to inspire and motivate other women/ girls to aim for the sky and achieve their goals. The initiatives of all the participants/trainees are lauded and given due recognition at annual functions of the college to motivate others to shed their inhibitions, recognize their latent potential and realize their dreams. Evidence of Success: The Women Empowerment Cell set up under the centres is running a free vocational training course for women from slum areas and the rural girls of the neighboring Villages. Thirty girls were enrolled and provided training between May -June 2019. These girls completed their course in: a) Computers b) Cosmetology c) Fashion designing The results of the continuous vocational training and counseling are encouraging. It has encouraged women to think
